

Word Classes

Noun - 'naming words'. These words name a person, place or thing.

E.g. house, apple, boy, school, England, David, etc.

Adjective - 'describing words'. These words describe a noun.

E.g. beautiful, happy, smelly, tall, delicious, etc.

Verb - 'doing words'. These words express an action or something you do.

E.g. walk, dream, laugh, be, dance, wish, etc.

Adverb - These words describe how the verb is being done.

E.g. quickly, angrily, greedily, slowly, suddenly, etc.

Prepositions - a word that tells you where or when something is in relation to something else.

E.g. on, after, beside, above, behind, over, etc.

Conjunctions - a word that joins two shorter sentences to make one longer sentence, e.g. *and, but, so, because, when, then, which, until*.

Sentence Types

2A Sentence

A sentence with two **adjectives** describing one **noun**. The two **adjectives** are next to each other in the sentence and separated by a comma.

E.g. 'The **ancient**, **wooden door** slowly creaked open.'

4A Sentence

A sentence with two **adjectives** about a first **noun** and then two **adjectives** about a second **noun**.

E.g. 'An **old**, **crooked tree** stood by the side of the **murky**, **brown river**.'

Conjunction Sentence

Two shorter sentences joined together by a **conjunction** word to make one long sentence.

E.g. 'Sarah had to take her umbrella with her **because** it was raining.'

Preposition Sentence

A sentence beginning with a **preposition** word or phrase.

E.g. '**Under the Christmas tree**, a pile of presents waited to be unwrapped.'

Adverb Sentence

A sentence beginning with an **adverb** to describe how the **verb** in the sentence is being carried out.

E.g. '**Angrily**, the girl **stormed** out of the room.'
