Destiny Millar, Y4 Elm said, 'Did you know Sikh men and woman don't cut their hair as they believe it is a gift from God?'



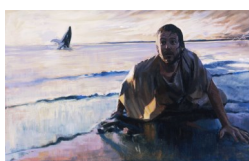

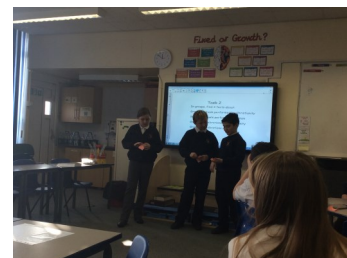
