We are continuing to practise writing our names in nursery this half term as well as looking at lots of books linked with the seaside.

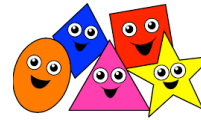
In phonics the some children are starting to learn some letter sounds. We are starting with the following letters,
